Our son joined Hallfield at aged 2 and has gone through the entire Hallfield system. More than anything, throughout that time we have seen him grow and build his character. He has developed into a confident and positive leader. In Year 7 he became Head Boy which helped him manage his understanding of his own values and moral compass and what it means to be a senior individual – taking more ownership and accountability.

As parents, we have seen him go from being a boy to a young man, particularly over these last few years in terms of his achievements and aims. The team building activities, for example the residential trip have been the making of my son. That's where I saw his leadership and ability to work as a team come into its own.

He has developed an interest in worldly issues. For example talking about COP and everything that was going on around that. It is great to see him actively take part in conversation at home and with his peers.

HallfieldSeniors has provided our son with an individualised education. Smaller, manageable class sizes means that he gets consistent feedback and has built a wonderful rapport with his teachers. Interaction with teachers has stepped up a notch at senior level. As parents, we hear from teachers at least fortnightly and can expect a consistent dialogue. He has gone from strength to strength particularly in terms of sports.

Our decision to join HallfieldSeniors started out with a bit of persuasion, but when we thought about it and spoke to the Governors and the Head Master it became clear that it was a natural continuation for our son. He had an opportunity to make something of himself with the senior experience here, rather than just going through the mill of another secondary school.
